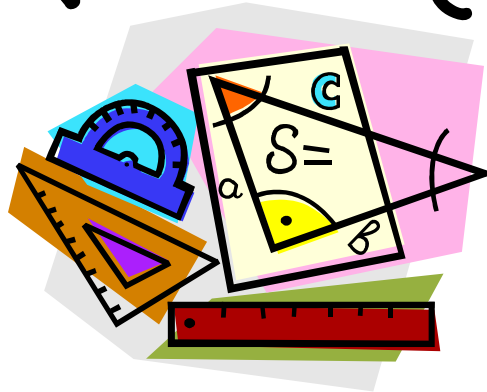
Again, I am so excited about meeting your child and beginning this school year. If you have any questions, feel free to contact me at the school (leave me a message if I am not there) or email me at the above address.

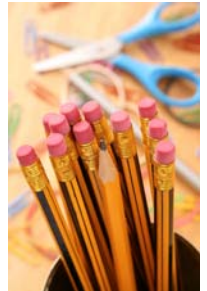
